DIRECT FROM THE D.O.C.

Hello NRASL Members,

I hope this message finds everyone in our soccer community doing well and excited for the upcoming Fall Season!

In the last two newsletters I wrote about the goal of creating a soccer environment where coaches and players can learn new ways to teach and learn the game. The four components being learned/taught in the NRASL training environment are Technique, Tactics, Physical, and Mental. Also, stated in the first newsletter was the future goal of developing a comprehensive system with the ultimate goal being the NRASL program replicating the training habits, expectations, and style of play of the high school program.

Last month's focus was the NRASL Player Development Overview that has been created to help guide the coaches in NRASL in respect to the overall philosophy of the program. The document covers current issues within the youth development system, such things as players being scouted and recruited at young ages to specialize in a sport. Also, it discusses the importance of putting the "kids" first. In keeping with the development of the soccer training environment designed to educate the players and coaches, we have developed an academic approach to their soccer development.

This upcoming season the Boys and Girls sides of the program will have the additional support of "Technical Directors". As NRASL continues to look toward the future to develop a "Vertical Structure Philosophy" that develops a cooperative and unified recreational and competitive program, the introduction of Technical Directors is vital to long term sustainability of the program.

Vertical Structure Philosophy

- Creates an internal soccer culture with both levels benefiting from the best that recreation & competitive levels have to offer
- Forever positively combining the levels of recreational and competitive soccer programs through player development and coaching development
- Establishment of club wide player development plan through the survey format
- Opens options for players and coaches to move horizontally or vertically through the system
- Consistent, focused and decentralized approach to director and coaching structure
- Allows for a few experienced coaches/directors to establish a workable structure that grows and expands as directors and coaches are produced in the system

The Technical Directors are a key piece to developing this structure and will help add passion, along with greater leadership abilities to help bring our program to the next level. They will report to the DOC, and will be responsible for helping lead and manage league wide training operations and coaching consistent with NRASL objectives. An added benefit to NRASL is they will be doing this as volunteers to the NRASL program. They will be sacrificing time from their families and life to give back to their soccer community and all the members of NRASL.

[Technical Directors as you read this I would like to say "Thank You" ahead of time for helping us make this one of the best youth programs in North Eastern Ohio! I know with your help over the years we will reach our goals and help inspire the next generation of soccer players!]

The process to accomplish the task of establishing this structure will take time, hard work, dedication and most of all patience. We live in a result oriented society where we want things to happen immediately, however program and player development are a marathon, not a sprint. The NRASL board and numerous other volunteers have taken the first steps to get us on the way toward creating the best environment possible for the kids!

Most recently, the Board, Coaches, volunteers and players have been working very hard for the last few months and days to prepare for our first annual "Cornfest tournament". This is an exciting time as we continue to develop a soccer culture that will live within the community and the players for many years to come. I look forward to a successful season, measured by growth and smiles, within the NRASL program.
