Greetings to our NRASL Family!

In our efforts to keep everyone more informed of the current projects, goals, events, and general activities of our league and board, we will be building and distributing a monthly newsletter to help everyone stay up to date and informed with what is going on inside your soccer league. This newsletter will contain information from all different areas inside the league as well as from our high school and national and international soccer news. The table on the left will show just where everything is.

We will also, from time to time, have a featured letter addressing a specific topic relevant to our league. This month, we will speak a bit about the NRASL Director of Coaching position. We will cover the specifics of the job requirement as well as why our board views this as a necessity for solid progress of our players, coaches, and program. The easiest way to cover this topic is by starting off with a few of the questions many of us have asked and then filling in the blanks!

Q. The first area we must cover is simply, what is a director of coaching (D.O.C.)?

A. A director of coaching is the one who provides the overall vision of a soccer league, club, organization. They also provide the planning, preparation and execution to make that vision a reality. This is done by every team of every age group and concerns every player as well as every coach. The D.O.C. coaches the coaches, but does not take away their own style or creativity to coach their team. Instead, he/she provides them with an ultimate goal, tools to use to get there, and guidance along the way to make sure the road is as smooth as possible. The D.O.C. is responsible for player development as well, but is not used to coach players. Instead, he/she develops curriculums for each group and then guides those who are doing the coaching. They are to be used by the coaches as teachers and information sources and will be the person holding coaches accountable for the information they teach and the methods in which they use to do it. The D.O.C. does this by making the selections as to who gets to coach or continue to and at what levels. This is to ensure all is fair to those involved and beneficial to the players.

Q. Now that we know what a D.O.C. does, why does the NRASL need one?

A. The NRASL currently has almost 80 coaches in its ranks, with 22 Travel coaches and over 50 Recreational coaches. We also have almost 800 players. A club this size with no direction or leadership on the technical and tactical level is just wasting time spinning its wheels. Even with individual, knowledgeable coaches, growth and development across the board is not possible and that means everyone suffers. The D.O.C. is that "Soccer Leader" that we need to help keep us pointed in the right direction.

Another great advantage of having a paid professional D.O.C. is that because all of our coaches are volunteers and parents, there is a great deal of emotion that is involved with teams and coaching that normally would not be present. A D.O.C. is an independent, clear mind with the knowledge and experience to make sure that the right person for the job is placed where they should be and has all the tools and support necessary to do the job right. Our D.O.C. has an extensive background in community and club coaching and has the credentials and experience to be able to make those impartial, tough decisions that keep us pointed in the right direction.

In addition, our D.O.C. handles the very necessary issue of player development. Aside from his analysis of coaches and players through observation at training and games, Everett designs and adjusts curriculum for the Recreational program and Travel program to address areas of deficiency, and then follows through to make sure that the adjustments made have addressed the problem sufficiently or if repetition or alteration is needed to help make his point.

Q. How do we make sure our coaches are using our D.O.C. in the way he SHOULD be utilized? A. Our D.O.C., Everett, conducts coaching clinics all year long for both Recreational and Travel coaches. Dates and times are posted in advance for coaches to be able to schedule around or attend others if a time is unavailable. Coaches can also contact Everett to get information outside the clinics as well as ask questions about drills, tactics, players, and all sorts of soccer related issues. If you see issues that Everett needs to be aware of or involved in, you may approach your coach at any time to ask about those things. You are also free to ask if your coach is participating in the training and classes being provided to them by the D.O.C. for their development to better coach your child. Please remember, the NRASL is strictly volunteer so coaches cannot be forced to participate, but they can be held accountable by concerned parents who want the best for their children!!!

Hello NRASL Members,

I hope this message finds everyone in our soccer community doing well!

For those that are new to the program my name is Everett Palache, and I am the Director of Coaching for North Ridgeville soccer.

The last two years have been a wonderful experience for me as the DOC of NRASL. I truly feel blessed to have the pleasure to work with such an outstanding community. During the first two years many things have been accomplished by the program that have established it as one of the most well run programs in North Eastern Ohio.

My goal, along with NRASL, has been to create an environment where coaches and players can learn new ways to teach and learn the game of soccer. The program's mission has been to develop more technical players for high school programs, in particular North Ridgeville High School. The techniques we have been working to improve are: Trapping, passing, dribbling and shooting to mention a few.

As the seasons progress one of our goals is to develop a comprehensive system of how NRASL players are trained and taught the game of soccer (*travel and in house*); with the ultimate goal being the NRASL program replicating the training habits, expectations, and style of play of the high school program. In year one, NRASL introduced a training curriculum focused completely on <u>offensive</u> techniques, terms and concepts. In year two, we introduced <u>defensive</u> techniques, terms, and concepts. Throughout the seasons we have had many of the coaches participate in coaching clinics where the curriculum philosophies and expectations have been taught and reviewed.

A key piece of the overall system that has been created and implemented is the NRASL <u>"Winter Training</u> <u>Program"</u> held at Force Sports in Rocky River. The last two winters have proven to be very helpful to the players that have participated in the program to improve their individual technique and our program as a whole. Thank you to all that participated and we look forward to seeing you and many more in the Winter Training Program when the snow returns (no rush on the snow:)). Also, a huge THANK YOU to the coaches and other administrators that volunteered time and assistance for this program!

To all referees an parents,

As you all know the spring 2012 season has ended. It was a great season and we surely couldn't complain about the weather! I wanted to take this time to thank you all for the hard work you put in this past season and to provide some insight about this coming fall.

This past season we had 55 referees which included many first time referees as well as a few certified referees. In all there were only 120 games which made it difficult to spread the wealth to all referees. Even though there were some referees who worked often, there were still a couple referees who received either 1 or 0 games due to their availability.

For those who were able to cover last moment games, I am very appreciative for your dedication. It is great to see everyone willing to help out when times get tough. A very special thank you goes out to Mark Schnell who was able to cover for one of our injured referees. Also, a strong get well and thank you to Gavan Vanover, the injured referee who broke his ankle in the middle of the last week. Both of these guys were a very big help to me with my first season.

Everyone else should be very proud of themselves too. As referees we often deal with ugly situations and comments from coaches or something spectators, and because every one of you were able to persevere and realize the comments were not personal attacks, you all deserve a huge congratulations. There were a few incidents referees had to deal with, and every one of them were dealt with properly! Each of you have had a chance to taste what it can be like as a certified referee; sometimes it can be brutal. For those of you interested in getting certified, as of now there are no scheduled clinics but there do tend to be clinics scheduled in late summer / early fall. I am still in the process of trying to get a clinic to NRASL to make for a more convenient location. Stay tuned for more details regarding this. For this coming fall, there will be a clinic scheduled sometime this summer for NRASL certification. I intend this clinic to take place at Root Rd. and to include field experience by putting referees on the field during scrimmages. In order to increase the number of games a referee has the potential to work, there will be more strict registration guidelines and more than likely a cap on the number of referees. Stay tuned for more information about this. On a final note, certified referees may like to know about the "Referee night with the Crew" game in Columbus. The date is 7/14/2012 in Columbus and includes a Q&A post game session with that game's referee crew. If interested, let me know and I will forward the details.

The **2012 UEFA European Football Championship**, commonly referred to as **Euro 2012**, will be the 14th European Championship for national football teams organized by UEFA. The final tournament will be hosted by Poland and Ukraine between 8 June and 1 July 2012. It is the first time that either nation has hosted the tournament. This bid was chosen by UEFA's Executive

Committee in 2007.^[1]

The final tournament features 16 nations, the last European Championship to do so (from Euro 2016 onward, there will be 24 finalists). Qualification was contested by 51 nations between August 2010 and November 2011 to join the two host nations in the tournament. The winner of the tournament gains automatic entry to the 2013 FIFA Confederations Cup hosted by Brazil.^[2]
